Types of Infectious disease to be prevented in schools and criteria for the period of suspension from attendance are stated in the Article 18 and 19 School Health and Safety Act. When your child is diagnosed of any School Infectious Disease in accordance with the Schools Health and Safety Act, it is necessary to immediately inform the school for taking action to suspend the child from attendance to preventing the spread of the disease. For the duration of the period your child is required to stay at home to heal and when the
